

Case Study 1

Nicola Daly, EAL Teacher from the British International School in Jeddah (2-18 years)

Great to meet you. We'd love to know a bit about yourself and your school.

Hello, I'm Nicola and I'm an EAL Teacher. I work at the British International School, which is a community co-educational school in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia. We have over 1,300 students from over 60 countries and more than 240 staff from 20 countries.

That's a very varied student population. What language profiles do your children typically have and what challenges came from these?

Many of our children speak English in the classroom but are immersed in other languages—often Arabic—at home. While these children appear fluent, their receptive language skills can be masked, making it difficult for teachers to spot gaps in understanding.

Our teaching team recognised the importance of consistent, high-quality teaching strategies. We needed a way to embed these strategies consistently across all classrooms and support early identification of any underlying SLCN.

You've used Infant Language Link for a year now. What made you choose this package and have you noticed any differences since you started using it?

Our head of Early Years, inspired by training on SLCN, saw the importance of early identification and sought a tool that could pick up all learners—particularly those with hidden needs. Infant Language Link has provided exactly that.

The assessments and interventions have had significant impact—helping us deliver support faster and more effectively. We've seen tangible improvements not only in language development but also in behaviour, confidence, and classroom focus.

Thanks for talking with us today, Julie. Can you tell us a little about your school?

We serve approximately 420 students aged 3–18, representing over 50 nationalities. Our student body is made up of both expatriate families and local residents, reflecting a rich mix of cultural and linguistic backgrounds. Around 65% of our students speak English as an additional language, with many from bilingual or multilingual homes.

What made you consider a screening and intervention package for oral language needs?

Some of our families do not have access to the health system, meaning children may miss out on key early language assessments. Also, speech therapists' resources and interventions are primarily in Swedish, which limits assessment and support for our English-speaking children. So, without in-house specialists, we needed a tool to help teachers recognise and respond to language difficulties early.

Why did you start using Speech Link and Language Link at your school?

As a small international school with limited funding, we began using the Infant Language Link package to support our Early Years and Key Stage 1 learners (4-8 years). We were drawn to the package because it offers a comprehensive screener combined with structured, measurable interventions, making it practical for classroom teachers and support staff to deliver.

And what changes have you noticed in class?

Less than a year in, we have already noticed some promising changes. There's now greater awareness among teachers and support staff of how to support children with SLCN in everyday classroom routines. We've also seen an improved confidence in identifying potential language difficulties early allowing us to become more informed and supportive with our communication with parents.

What advice would you give to a school using Speech Link and Language Link?

Make use of the screening results to inform further, help with progress tracking, and contribute to a broader picture of need across the school. Use the in-package training so staff feel confident using the screener and understand how to implement suggested strategies. Finally, clear communication with families is vital, especially when navigating differences in national healthcare systems or cultural expectations about development.

Thanks so much for taking time out of your busy day to chat with us! Can you start by telling us a bit about yourself and what you do?

You're welcome! I'm Nicola Sheldon, and I'm a SENCo at Doha English Speaking School in Qatar.

Lovely to meet you. What made you feel that our packages could work well for your setting?

Drawing from experience using Speech Link and Language Link where I worked previously in the UK, I advocated for the introduction of these tools in my new role.

Infant Language Link allows us to identify **66** We've seen fantastic children who would not have otherwise been flagged. Some seemed to be getting on well in class and were particularly adept at using nonverbal communication, making it difficult for

teachers to recognise any underlying language difficulties without formal assessment.

It sounds like Language Link really helped uncover hidden needs. Has it influenced how you support your children now?

It has, introducing Language Link helped standardise our approach. Staff receive training and the classroom resources empower staff to improve quality-first teaching across the board.

The programme helps bridge communication between support staff and classroom teachers, and conversations about pupils' progress are now backed by objective data. Teachers often express surprise at children identified by the assessments, admitting they wouldn't have otherwise noticed the language gaps.

That's wonderful. What impact have you seen from using Language Link over time?

We've seen fantastic outcomes. Pupils from our early intervention groups are now progressing confidently. Our Year 1 cohort, which previously received FS2 assessments and interventions, is now achieving age-appropriate scores and making solid academic progress. Importantly, external

> referrals have decreased, indicating that early in-school support is working.

We've also strengthened our relationship with speech pathologists, using the Language Link data to support collaborative planning.

If you look at the bigger picture, what would you say has been the overall difference these tools have made?

Speech Link and Language Link have become foundational tools in our school's approach to language development. They've improved outcomes, empowered staff, opened-up parent communication and most importantly, ensured that no child goes unnoticed. The return is undeniable.


